Course Description

In response to the importance of fluency in thought, and the demand for fluent speakers in a foreign language, speaking is a valuable activity for students of all skill levels. Argument teaches useful skills for academic pursuits and life more generally. Activities such as discussion and debate engage students in a variety of cognitive and linguistic practices: building confidence in public speaking; expressing ideas eloquently; and developing sharp, concise arguments. Developing skills in critical thinking; leadership; researching; time management; teamwork and collaboration are benefits of engaging in active discussion and debating.

Course Outcomes

By the end of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Use digital tools, such as search engines and library databases to find print and electronic resources
- 2. Evaluate research resources for quality, and properly cite these sources in students' own work in addition to synthesizing research materials through coherent reasoning
- 3. Critically and creatively express concepts or ideas in written and spoken English
- 4. Construct researched and logical arguments
- 5. Present well-researched arguments to support theses
- 6. Demonstrate responsive and coherent rebuttals to proposed theses
- 7. Propose alternative solutions to theses
- 8. Contribute actively and cooperatively in teamwork such as debates
